Thank you for your interest in becoming a Distinguished Fellow of the American Osteopathic College of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation (FAOCPMR-D). This designation was approved by the Executive Council of the College in 2011 and refined by the Conclave of Fellows during the latter part of 2013.

To qualify for this award, applicants must be nominated by a Distinguished Fellow; Fellows of the College may make nomination suggestions to any Distinguished Fellow. The criteria for awarding the Honorary Title of Distinguished Fellow of the American Osteopathic College of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation include current and/or past sustained and exemplary activity in multiple of the following areas:

- Significant service to the osteopathic profession
- Involved on committees, boards or activities of either AOCPMR, AOBPMR or AOA
- Prior or current involvement in professional organizations on an international, national, state or local level that concern physical medicine and rehabilitation
- Involved in significant ongoing research contributions to the specialty of physical medicine and rehabilitation or any subspecialty areas of physical medicine and rehabilitation
- Sustained exemplary activity must be in the period since achieving Fellow status
- Involved in the development of a clinical training program as the program director, (initial or continuing position)
- Service to the profession that has achieved national, state, or regional recognition
- Recognition or awards for excellence in physical medicine and rehabilitation (or its subspecialty areas) from local, state and national organizations

The Conclave of Distinguished Fellows will consider nominations and, once approved, will submit recommendations to the Executive Council for final approval. Criteria for selection to this title will be (1) current status as a Fellow of the American Osteopathic College of Physical Medicine & Rehabilitation (FAOCPMR) for a minimum of 10 years and (2) a letter of nomination outlining the reason for this designation. All applications must contain a current CV of the Nominee. Deadlines for nomination to this award will be the same as nominations to the title of Fellow (August 15). The Conclave of Fellows will consider nominations annually at its Conclave and recommendations will be submitted to the Executive Council for final approval. Successful candidates must receive unanimous approval of the AOCPMR Executive Council. Distinguished Fellows of the AOCPMR are authorized to use the designation FAOCPMR-D as long as they remain as members in good standing of the AOCPMR.

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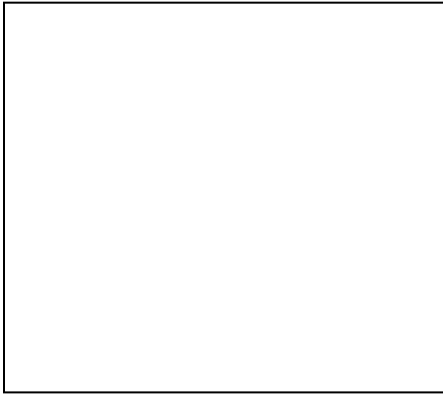
